Privacy Policy

May 4, 2018

Blackhills Football Club (“BFC”) understands that you care about how we collect, use, and share information when you interact with our website or submit information via online or paper forms, and we value the trust you place in us. This privacy policy explains:

- the types of information we collect;
- how we use and protect that information;
- the types of information we may share with others and under what circumstances; and
- how to update your information.

When this Privacy Policy Applies

This privacy policy applies to any website that links to it, any paper or electronic form that references it or to which it is attached, and the information we collect when you interact with us through social media. It does not apply to non-BFC websites that may link to our website or be linked from our website. Please review the privacy policies on those other websites to understand their privacy practices.

We may make changes to this privacy policy from time to time. We will post those changes, and they will become effective when they are posted. Your continued use of our website following the posting of any changes will mean you accept those changes.

Information We Collect From or About You

Information You Give Us: Our website includes features that permit you to enter contact information and other information about you or another person, such as during the registration process. This information may include, for example, name, mailing address, ZIP code, phone number, email address, and payment information for our registration fees. BFC also collects certain essential medical information from players.

Information Collected Automatically: When you interact with our website, certain information about your use of our website is automatically collected by us and by third parties, including through the use of cookies, web beacons, and other storage technologies.

We collect much of this information using Google Analytics, a web analytics service provided by Google, Inc., on our website. Google Analytics uses cookies or other tracking technologies to help us analyze how users interact with and use the website, compile reports on our website’s activity, and provide other services related to our website’s activity and usage. The technologies used by Google may collect information such as your IP address, time of visit, whether you are a return visitor, and

any referring website. We do not use Google Analytics to gather information that personally identifies you. The information generated by Google Analytics will be transmitted to and stored by Google and will be subject to Google's privacy policies (<https://www.google.com/policies/privacy/partners/>). These third parties may use these technologies to collect information about you when you use the websites. They may collect information about your online activities over time and across different websites and other online services. They may also use persistent identifiers to track your Internet usage across other websites in their networks beyond the websites. They may use this information to provide you with interest-based advertising or other targeted content. While we do not knowingly provide these entities with information that personally identifies you such third parties may, with sufficient data from other sources, be able to personally identify you, unknown to us.

Most web browsers automatically accept cookies but, if you prefer, you can usually modify your browser setting to disable or reject cookies. If you delete your cookies or if you set your browser to decline cookies, some features of our website may not work or may not work as designed. Your browser or device may include "Do Not Track" functionality. Our information collection and disclosure practices, and the choices that we provide to visitors, will continue to operate as described in this privacy policy whether or not a Do Not Track signal is received.

Information from Social Media: BFC maintains a social media presence. When you interact with us on a social media platform, including through the Facebook or Twitter widgets on our website, we may collect information that you make available to us on that page, including your username and other information included in your posts. If you choose to log in to your account with or through a social networking service, we and that service may share certain information about you and your activities.

How We Use Information We Collect From or About You

We may use information you give us or information we collect about you to:

- Provide you with information about BFC activities, to facilitate registration, and to process fee payments.
- Obtain emergency medical treatment for players.
- Communicate with you, including to respond to your inquiries and fulfill your requests.
- Provide, maintain, personalize, optimize, and improve the website, or to remember you when you leave and return to the website.

- Detect, investigate, and prevent activities that may violate our policies or be fraudulent or illegal.

How We Share Information About You

We may share the information we collect:

- With companies who work on our behalf to provide and support the website and our club activities. For example, we use Demosphere to host and maintain our website, and to process fee payments.
- As necessary or required by our partner organizations. For example, we share certain player roster information with the Thurston County Youth Soccer Association and Washington Youth Soccer, primarily to facilitate player registration and their recordkeeping.

We may use or disclose information about you if required to do so by law or on the good-faith believe that such sharing is necessary to (a) conform to applicable law or comply with legal process served on us or our website; (b) protect and defend our rights or property, the website, or our users; or (c) act to protect the personal safety of our employees and agents, other users of the website, or members of the public.

We may change our corporate organization while providing the website. In that case, we may transfer to another entity, its affiliates or service providers some or all information about you in connection with such reorganization. We cannot promise that an acquiring party or the merged entity will have the same privacy practices or treat your information the same as described in the Privacy Statement.

Updating Your Information

If you are registered with our website, you can update your information by logging in and using the tools we make available. You may also contact us using the information at the end of this policy. If you contact us directly, we may require you to verify your identity. We may not accommodate a request to change or delete personal information if we believe doing so would violate any law or legal requirement, or cause the information to be incorrect.

How We Secure Information We Collect From or About You

We use a combination of physical, technical, and administrative safeguards to protect the information we collect. While we use these precautions to safeguard such information, we cannot guarantee the security of the networks, systems, servers, devices, and databases we operate or that are operated on our behalf.
